## School Uniform policy

It is our school policy that all children wear school uniform when attending school, or when participating in a school-organised event outside normal school hours. We believe wearing uniform

- promotes a sense of pride in the school
- engenders a sense of community and belonging towards the school
- is practical and smart
- identifies the children with the school
- prevents children from coming to school in fashion clothes that could be distracting in class
- makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance
- is regarded as suitable wear for school and good value for money by most parents
- is designed with health and safety in mind

### **Uniform**

All pupils are expected to wear school uniform (except Nursery).

Polo Shirts, Green School Jumpers, P.E. Kit and Track Suits are available from our joint suppliers. Book bags, ties, and baseball caps are available from the school office.

Children should come to school wearing PE kit with track suits on PE days.

All KS2 children are also expected to have a one-piece swimming costume and swimming cap for swimming lessons.

'Hoodies' as part of school uniform are not allowed.

All shoes or sandals must be suitable for school. Fashion shoes such as slip-ons, ankle boots, shoes with heels, plastic or open-toe shoes are NOT acceptable. Trainers may only be worn in school on PE Days.

### Jewellery

Jewellery, with the exception of watches, should not be worn as it can be hazardous and the school cannot take responsibility for loss or damage. Exceptions to this rule are ear studs in pierced ears, watches and small objects of religious significance, such as a crucifix on a chain. Children are to either remove these objects during PE and games, or cover them with a plaster, to prevent them from causing injury.

### Hair

Long hair must be tied back with **red** or **green** elastics only, no other colour hair band or fascinators are accepted.

The school does not permit children to have 'extreme' haircuts that could serve as a distraction to other children.

### **The role of parents**

We ask all parents who send their children to our school to support the school uniform policy. We believe that parents have a duty to send their children to school correctly dressed and ready for their daily schoolwork. One of the responsibilities of parents is to ensure that their child has the correct uniform, and that it is clean and in good repair.

If any parent would like the school to modify the uniform policy, they should make representation, in the first instance, to the Headteacher. The school welcomes children from all backgrounds and faith communities. If there are serious reasons, for example on religious grounds, why parents want their child to wear clothes that differ from the school uniform, the school will look sympathetically at such requests.

Should any parent have financial reasons for being unable to provide the correct uniform, the Headteacher, with their permission, will refer them to an appropriate agency for assistance.

The school requires parents to name all items of clothing. Any unnamed items that have not been claimed at the end of term will be disposed of at the discretion of the Headteacher.

### **Sanctions**

Should a child not meet the expectations of this policy and disregard the need to wear appropriate uniform parents will be contacted to help resolve the issue. Should the problem continue parents will be requested to remove the child from the school in order to rectify the situation, returning the child to school the same or following day.
